- 22. Iceland is the best chess country in the world :-)
- 23. If possible, I would prefer an even earlier start. 1 pm for example
- 24. If possible, it would be nice if there were no music played in the harpa during the rounds.
- 25. If rounds are to begin at 15:00, it will almost totally eliminate normal Icelandic players with normal jobs, me included!
- 26. In 2014, there was one major improvement over 2013: the screens were lowered as soon as the sun came out, so players could see the boards normally. For 2015, I hope to see one more improvement over 2014: no concert music at the same time as the games are played! In the earlier rounds of the 2014 event, the music was very noticeable and it is a distracting factor during the games. Also, if possible, to make the starting times of the rounds as similar as possible. So, for example, 9 days at 4:30 and last day at 1 PM, or something like that. It is difficult to play at 4:30, PM, 9:30 AM, different times on the weekends etc. Almost half the tournament is played at a time different than the 'usual' 4:30, so its hard to know what kind of schedule to get on. If the tournament is split into two sections, 9 rounds should be enough so there is no need for a double round. Perhaps more of a selection of restaurants where the coupons could be used?:) Before, there was the Indian one and the one close to it for dinner, but in 2014 it seemed like the dinner options were very limited. However, the lunch place was great (can't remember what it's called), generous amount of food and delicious, so definitely keep that one! Thank you to the organizing committee for their efforts!
- 27. It could be interesting to have 2 groups, 2000 + and one from 0 to 2200.

There are two main arguments for having a floor for ratings a) ensuring players get tough opposition every round minimising spread in rating and b) providing good norm opportunities by ensuring the average rating is high enough. From this point of view the cut-off should be 2050 as this means that even a win against the lowest rated player contributes towards a norm unlike wins against much lower rated players. Need stricter approach to spectators using mobile phones/letting phone ring in hall. Hoping to return to Iceland in 2015 but hoping for Euro Team rather than the Open (unable to play in both).
- 35. So, my decision to participate doesn't depend on the format, however, I like the 'one group'. As an amateur and long-time friend of Iceland(ers) I will continue to try to come. The atmosphere is great. The only thing is that it must fit in my working schedule.

- 58. Your calculation of the rating performance (which is used for some prizes) seems to be flawed. A performance shouldn't drop after a win against a weaker player. If a 2100 player beats a grandmaster and a 1200 player, that's clearly a higher achievement than beating a 2100 and a 1600 player. So significantly lower rated opponents should be lifted to a lower threshold rating like "rating 400". Otherwise the performance depends too much on the luck of not playing against players who wreck your opponents average rating.
